## Why not come and train to become an EcoTeam Leader!

We have a training day on **Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> October (9.45 - 3pm) at International Community Centre, Mansfield Road, Nottingham. It's free!**

### ***What is an EcoTeam Leader?***

As an EcoTeam Leader, you don't need to be an expert - you just need to be interested in taking simple actions on shopping ethically, saving resources, saving energy and traveling wisely. A Leader helps to recruit team members and organise the 5 monthly meetings (up to 2 hrs each) that take the EcoTeam from start to finish.

Using the information and free resources from the training, you can help a team of about 6-8 people in your street, community group or club to reduce their ecofootprint.

### ***What does the training involve?***

It only takes **1 day** to train as a volunteer EcoTeam Leader. We'll take you through the programme, the support materials, tips for a successful Team and so on – so that you can take that knowledge back to your own group and guide the other households through the process. (Of course we're always available if you need extra support).

There are a couple of places left, so please contact us if you want to come along as soon as possible. Lunch will be provided and your travelling expenses will be reimbursed.

This training is only available to residents in Broxtowe Borough, Gedling Borough and Nottingham City.
